**Course Number:** AGRI 2901  
**Course Title** Cooperative Experience  
**Prerequisite(s):** AGRI 2204 and 24 Credit Hours in AGRI or HORT.

**Catalog Description:** Instructor supervised on-the-job training to gain experience in an agribusiness occupation. Apply skills and principles learned and acquire additional skills for growth and advancement.

**II. COURSE OBJECTIVES:** *Course will:*

1. Give each student the opportunity to plan a supervised work experience in the field of employment which they have pursued educationally.
2. Provide the student with the opportunity to experience the "real world" of employment and its surroundings.
3. Discuss with other students the Cooperative Internship experience, sharing learning activities and situations.
4. Prepare students to become experts in the professional field through agriculture-related experiences in their field of study.
5. Expand knowledge and expertise in an agricultural field.
6. Increase depth of knowledge and expertise in agriculture, related to the students learning goals.
7. Enhance ability to adapt to changes in technology.
8. Enhance the ability to adapt to the agriculture economy.
9. Enhance ability to adapt to societal influences.
10. Further, develop and enhance the ability to communicate with coworkers and supervisors.
11. Develop critical thinking skills.
12. Assess and comprehend societal issues within agriculture.
13. Further, develop and enhance soft skills within agriculture.
14. Develop leadership skills and qualities, to become an outstanding leader and team player within the agriculture industry.
15. Demonstrate professional behavior, appearance, and attitude.
16. Demonstrate punctuality and self-discipline.
17. Accept responsibility for tasks assigned.
18. Develop and enhance networking abilities.

19. Comprehend and appreciate diversity in the workforce.
20. Analyze issues, problems, and situations in the agriculture internship.

19. Create a list of objectives/learning goals you wish to achieve while at the Cooperative site.
20. Enhance current skills gained through experience here at Southeast Community College.
21. Manage personal finances.
22. Make impactful decisions in regard to housing and site location.
23. Participate in an 8 week, 300 hours (minimum) Cooperative Experience, of the student's choice within the Agriculture Industry.
