Course Number: ARTS2804
Course Title: Art Practicum
Prerequisite(s): None
Catalog Description: Under a cooperative educational experience students can earn credit by working a minimum of 45, 90, or 135 hours per semester in conjunction with staff at an art gallery and/or museum. This practical experience will include, but not be limited to, the selection process, sales, installation, and promotion.

II. COURSE OBJECTIVES: *Course will:*

- A. Focus on all aspects of gallery management and/or museum management.
- B. Teach basic skills in installation, display, and dissemination of information (docent).
- C. Familiarize students with the selection process of artists and works for exhibition. Have students take an active role in promotional events and activities.
