I. CATALOG DESCRIPTION

Course Number: NURS 1410
Course Title: Fundamentals of Nursing
Prerequisite(s):
Pre/Co Requisite(s): NURS 1400

Catalog Description: This course provides opportunities to develop competencies necessary to meet basic human needs in a safe, legal, and ethical manner using critical thinking and the nursing process. The course integrates the psychomotor, cognitive and affective domains both in the lab and classroom. Students demonstrate competency in performing basic nursing skills in the program laboratory.

II. COURSE OBJECTIVES: *Course will:*

1. Relate nursing process as a method of problem solving related to a nursing care plan framework.
2. Emphasize nursing skills and identification of basic human needs as it relates to the nursing process.
3. Utilize the program laboratory to introduce the student to a simulated environment to practice and demonstrate competency of essential nursing skills.
4. Introduce the concept of patient centered care in the classroom and integrate into the laboratory setting.
