I. CATALOG DESCRIPTION

Course Number: NURS 1415
Course Title: Fundamentals of Nursing Clinical
Prerequisite(s):
Corequisite(s): NURS 1410

Catalog Description: This course provides opportunities to perform skills necessary to meet basic human needs in a safe, legal, and ethical manner using critical thinking and the nursing process. The course integrates the psychomotor, cognitive and affective domains in the clinical setting. Students will perform skills in which they have demonstrated competency in while caring for a patient in the clinical setting.

II. COURSE OBJECTIVES:

1. Relate nursing process as a problem solving method to the care of a patient in the clinical setting.
2. Provide opportunities for the student to assist patients in meeting basic human needs and performance of skills in the clinical setting.
3. Integrate the concept of patient centered care while caring for a patient in the clinical setting.
