Course Title Rodeo (Men's and Women's)

Prerequisite(s): NONE

Catalog Description: This course presents the rules of the sport while instructing individuals on the fundamentals of all rodeo events, both men's and women's individual and team. The class teaches individuals how to contribute to a group effort while encouraging individuals to excel in a specialized rodeo area. Participants are taught how to recognize and solve specific rodeo event problems. Presents the rules of each college rodeo event while instructing individuals of the fundamentals and techniques necessary to compete in both men's and women's rodeo events.
