Course Number: ECED 2901

Course Title Child Care Head Teacher Cooperative Experience

Prerequisite(s): Program Permission required. ECED1050, 1060, 1110, 1120, 1160, 1220, 1224, 1230, 1260, 1630, 1610, 1620, 1640 and 2060 and four of the five general education core classes. Open only to declared students graduating with an A.A.S. degree. Current first aid/CPR certification/ ECED1112 Applied Infant and Toddler Concepts required for completion in an infant or toddler setting. ECED1475 Professional In-Home Care required for completion in an in-home child care or nanny setting.

Catalog Description: This Course provides continued practical work experience for a lead teacher in a licensed child care facility. Site must meet certain guidelines set by the program. Work experience is paid employment. Presentation and discussion of child development topics and practicum experience.
