Course Number: HMRS 1212
Course Title: Practicum Seminar 2
Prerequisite(s): HMRS 1124

Catalog Description: Under indirect supervision, students work with selected clients and demonstrate acquired skills and principles studied in the classroom and previous practicum experience. Students apply these skills at Human Services agencies. A required seminar meets weekly to discuss application of theory practice, resources, and professional trends.

1. Provide the student with the opportunity to work independently and as a team member in a human services agency.
2. Provide the student with the opportunity to demonstrate human services theory, philosophy, values and skills while working with clients in a human service agency.
