I. CATALOG DESCRIPTION

Course Number: PARM 2900
Course Title: Paramedic Clinical 3
Prerequisite(s): Enrollment in Paramedic program or by instructor approval.

Catalog Description: This clinical course incorporates an educational approach to assist the student in the application and demonstration of the knowledge and skills learned in the Paramedic program within the EMS field setting. Students shall be placed on an ambulance under the direct supervision of an approved field preceptor and will be required to demonstrate the ability to perform as a competent team leader, demonstrate thorough patient assessment skills & formulate proper treatment plans for each situation encountered.

II. COURSE OBJECTIVES: *Course will:*

1. Provide EMS field opportunities to practice ventilating patients.
2. Provide EMS field opportunities to demonstrate competency at endotracheal intubation, intravenous cannulation and medication administration.
3. Provide EMS field opportunities to practice basic and advanced electrocardiograph (ECG) interpretation.
4. Provide EMS field opportunities to perform patient assessments.
5. Provide EMS field opportunities to observe and participate in the treatment of cardiac and other medical and traumatic emergencies in the pre-hospital setting.
6. Provide opportunities to cultivate leadership and decision-making skills while functioning as the primary provider under the direction of an EMS Field Preceptor.
