Course Title:	Clinical Education for Pharmacy Technicians

Catalog Description:	This course emphasizes basic pharmacy practices and exposes students to the practical aspects of dispensing, compounding, and inventory control at an “on the job” training site in institutional, retail, or alternative pharmacy practice settings.
